# **Funding Opportunity Overview**

<u>National Marine Sanctuary Foundation</u>, in partnership with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, is excited to offer funding for a contractor to provide scientific and professional services to evaluate existing tools and practices to advance standardized data management for elkhorn coral.

# **Funding Availability and Eligibility**

**Total Funding Available:** Up to \$50,000

The objective of the request for proposals is to seek a contractor to support elkhorn coral recordkeeping management.

Funding is available for U.S. individuals or organizations based in the United States or territories.

Match is not required.

## **BACKGROUND**

This project will further the work of <u>Mission: Iconic Reefs</u>, a collaboration between NOAA's Office of Habitat Conservation and Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary, the National Marine Sanctuary Foundation, the State of Florida, Coral Restoration Foundation, Mote Marine



Laboratory and Aquarium, The Florida Aquarium, The Nature Conservancy, Reef Renewal and University of Florida. The partners aim to restore coral reef ecosystems along the Florida Reef Tract.

Elkhorn coral (*Acropora palmata*) populations have significantly declined in the Florida Keys, and recordkeeping tools are needed to advance collaboration between conservation practitioners and ensure effective restoration solutions are implemented. This project will further efforts to produce a population management strategy for *A. palmata* that assesses the needs, gaps, and function requirements for restoration of this critical species.

# **OVERVIEW OF FUNDING OPPORTUNITY**

## Objective

The contractor will provide scientific and professional services to evaluate existing tools and practices to advance standardized data management for elkhorn coral.

This work would build on work previously funded by the Foundation to the Smithsonian's National Zoo & Conservation Biology Institute. The existing project is developing a status assessment based on practitioner input, management recommendations for the marine heat wave, and a final status report that will summarize the major areas of work remaining. The Foundation would connect the selected contractor with the points of contact for this existing work to share relevant documents.

# **SCOPE OF WORK**

# Required Tasks:

The contractor's duties will include:

- Conduct a comprehensive review of current recordkeeping tools and practices based on work previously undertaken by a Foundation-funded project by the Smithsonian's National Zoo & Conservation Biology Institute
- As needed, continue engagement with conservation practitioners, researchers, and managers to understand their data requirements
- Identify areas of improvement and functional requirements for elkhorn coral population management recordkeeping
- Collaborate with others to create a report that outlines the recommendations from the results of the above duties

# **Required Skill Set:**

- Proven writing skills in relevant subject area
- Ability to synthesize information and summarize materials concisely
- Ability to work collaboratively with others

#### **DELIVERABLES**



Deliverables include advancing all of the tasks outlined above and providing a final report of accomplishments to the Foundation by June 30th, 2025.

#### FUNDING AVAILABILITY AND PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

The maximum amount for this contract is not to exceed \$50,000 and will reimburse the hourly rate of the contractor for the work performed as well as approved travel, as needed. The project timeline is expected to span from December 1st, 2024 to June 30th 2025, with the awardee announced by November 20th, 2024. Final deliverables are required to be sent to the Foundation no later than June 30th, 2025. The timeline of project activities and overall completion should be clearly addressed and outlined in the applicant's proposal.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Eligible applicants must meet the following criteria:

- The applicant must not have a paid staff member serving on the Foundation's Board of Trustees.
- Project work is conducted by a U.S. individual or organization based in the United States, territories, or Freely Associated States. Federal government agencies, employees, or foreign entities are not eligible to apply.
- The applicant can provide a U.S. federal tax ID #.


#### **HOW TO APPLY**
